impart vt. 给予；告知，透露；传授

1. (convey, make known) 传达；传授，告知

His production of the play fails to impart a sense of excitement. 他执导的那部戏没能传达出一种兴奋感。

He told them that he had a terrible piece of news to impart. 他说他有一条可怕的消息要告诉他们。

Our aim is to impart knowledge.

我们的目的是传授知识。

2. (bestow) 给予 ; 赋予

She managed to impart great elegance to the unpretentious dress she was wearing.

她把身上那件朴实无华的连衣裙穿出了非常高雅的气质。

[vt]. 1. (spoil) [+person, child] 纵容；放任；
迁就

He did not agree with indulging children.

他不赞成纵容娇惯孩子。

It pleased me to indulge her.

我很高兴宠着她。

2. (gratify) [+passion,+fantasy] 满足 , 沉湎于
He returned to Britain so that he could indulge
his passion for football.

他重返英国 , 为的是可以尽情释放自己对足球的激情。

Blogs allow individuals to indulge grandiose
fantasies of who they are.

博客使个人可以恣意对自己的身份角色进行夸大的幻想。

I was just indulging my curiosity. 我只是在满足
自己的好奇心。

3. to indulge yourself 让自己享受一下

The winners will indulge themselves at a luxury hotel.

获胜者将在一家豪华酒店尽情享受一番。

You can indulge yourself without spending a fortune.

你不用花很多钱就可以好好犒劳一下自己。

[vi]. 沉溺；满足；放任

1. (treat yourself) 满足自己的欲望；尽情享受

Traditionally, Christmas parties are a time to indulge. 传统上，圣诞聚会是尽情享受的时候。

The hotel spa is the perfect place to indulge. 该酒店的健康美容中心是让人尽情享受的理想场所

to indulge in sth

a. [+treat, luxury] 享受...

Guests can indulge in a private barbecue on the deck. 客人们可以在露天平台上享用私家烤肉野餐。

b. [+pastime , +passion] 享受... , 满足...

Here she was also able to indulge in another of her favourite pastimes, dancing. 在这里她还可以尽情享受另一项自己最喜爱的娱乐活动——跳舞。

**2. to indulge in sth [+bad behaviour] 沉溺于...
; 放纵于...**

I think for a brief while I indulged in a very mild form of stalking. 我觉得有那么一小段时间我稍稍有点沉迷于跟踪别人。

Members of the cabinet indulged in favouritism. 内阁成员们一味偏袒。

The veil is worn to remind you not to indulge in lust. 佩戴面纱是为了提醒你不要再沉湎于肉欲。

3. < 非正式 > (drink) 喝酒 ; (尤指) 纵酒

No, thanks. I never indulge. 不, 谢谢。我从不喝酒。

I thought you didn't indulge.

我原以为你不喝酒。

to indulge in sth 喝... ; 纵饮...

Only rarely will she indulge in a glass of wine. 她只是偶尔喝一杯葡萄酒。

jealous adj. 妒忌的；羡慕的；精心守护的；吃醋的

1. (in love) 猜忌的；妒忌的

I can't imagine my wife making me jealous. 我无法想象妻子会让我心生猜忌。

She got insanely jealous and there was a terrible fight. 她妒忌得发疯，然后大吵了一架。

2. (envious) [+person] 忌妒的 ; 妒羡的
You're jealous because the record company
rejected your idea.
你嫉妒是因为唱片公司拒绝了你的想法。
to be jealous of sb 嫉妒某人 She is jealous
of her sister. 她嫉妒她的姐姐。
to be jealous of sth 妒羡某事物 She was
jealous of his wealth. 她忌妒他的富有。
